# **CLSF** History

Founded in 1976, the Crystal Lake Soccer Federation, is incorporated as a not-for-profit organization, and has IRS 501c3 charitable status.



## CLSF Recreational League Details

- Two 8-week sessions
  - Fall: Early/Mid September End of October
  - · Spring: Mid April Early June
- No standings kept; scores reported to assist in scheduling a more equitable spring season.
- CLSF DOES NOT supply any kind of trophy or award.
  - Any awards given are up to the individual teams.
- Uniform and Equipment pickup S
  - Saturday August 27, 9AM to 4 PM at the Soccerhouse.
  - If you can't be there, send an assistant or someone from your team.

#### Games

- Schedules
  - Schedules to be posted ~ August 20<sup>th</sup>
  - Although not guaranteed, all special scheduling requests will be reviewed.
- Rainouts/Cancellations/Make-up Games
  - Inclement weather may cause SOME but not necessarily all games to be cancelled, depending on the weather and field conditions—it depends on the fields, as some drain better
  - SHOW UP at Lippold unless
  - Real-time updates will be posted CLSF.org

#### Games

- When Thor Guard alarm goes off clear the field
  - Strobe light flashes on top of Soccerhouse
- Reenter the field only if the "all clear" is given
  - 3 five-second blast sounds
- If the game is interrupted by alarm
  - Players and spectators should go immediately to their vehicles.
  - Coaches should go to Soccerhouse where the decision will be made to resume or terminate game.
- If prior to the game
  - Coaches should come to Soccerhouse
  - Do not wait in your car.

# Additional CLSF Programs

- TOPSoccer Soccer for special needs children
- Academy
  - For players kindergarten through second grade looking for a more challenging environment and wish to play more.
  - Each player **must play** on a recreational team to be eligible to play in the Academy Program
- Select
  - For players 3<sup>rd</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> grade looking for a more challenging environment to play more.
  - Each player **must play** on a recreational team to be eligible to play in the Select Program.
- Force
  - For those players that want increased training and a play against higher level of competition.

- Picture Day
  - Location: Lippold Park next to The Soccer House
  - Details
    - Arrive 45 minutes prior to each teams' game.
    - All ordering will be done on-line through VIP (additional details to follow).
    - Head coach and assistant coaches receive free team plaque.

### Competitive Player Policy

- Competitive players may participate on a CLSF Recreational Team, however:
  - CLSF must be advised of the competitive player's status at registration or prior to being rostered with a rec team
- Competitive team players will be distributed equitably among recreational teams.
- CLSF may not be able to honor requests by competitive players for placement on specific rec teams.

## Guest Player Policy

- If a coach finds that his/her team will not have enough players to field a full team, including substitutes, players from another team, in the same age group may be used
- Boys CANNOT be used as guest players on girls' teams
- Competitive players may not be used as guest players

## Referee Training Games

- Prior to each season there will be a need for teams to participate in referee training games.
- The number of teams and age groups needed will vary depending on the number of new referees in that age group.
